

Training grant



Approved qualifications

The following qualifications are approved by the Ministry of Health to receive funding through the training grant. The 'average duration' refers to the expected time for a trainee to complete the qualification.

New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing - Level 2

40 credits, average duration 7 months

This programme aims to develop the entry-level skills and knowledge to provide person-centred support in the health and wellbeing sectors, and to provide a training pathway for entry into careers in the health and wellbeing sectors.

Training grant funding allocation: \$400.

New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing - Support Work - Level 3

70 credits, average duration 12 months

This industry training programme aims to develop the skills and knowledge required to support and empower people in home and community settings. It is targeted at people who are employed as support workers and need to develop the skills and knowledge required to effectively support people to achieve their goals and in their daily life.

Training grant funding allocation: \$600.

New Zealand Certificate in Youth Work - Level 3

40 credits, average duration 9 months

Trainees undertaking this qualification will learn about the Youth Development Strategy Aotearoa and Te Tiriti o Waitangi.

Training grant funding allocation: \$600.

New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Advanced Support) - Level 4

70 credits, average duration 12 months

This qualification builds the knowledge and skills required of senior support workers in a variety of health, disability and aged support contexts within home-based, community and residential settings.

Training grant funding allocation: \$700.

New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Social and Community Services) Community Facilitation - Level 4

120 credits, apprenticeship

The purpose of this qualification is to provide organisations within the health and wellbeing sectors with graduates who have the skills, knowledge and behaviours required to work alongside people, family and/or whānau accessing social and community services, under broad guidance. This is an entry level qualification designed for people already working in, or those who intend to develop a career supporting the health and wellbeing of people, family and/or whānau and the wider community.

Training grant funding allocation: \$2,000.

Limited Credit Programme: Dementia - Level 4

20 credits, average duration 6 months, no pre-requisites

This programme supports caregivers working in or entering the dementia residential field and represents the essential knowledge and skills required for working with residents affected by dementia.

Training grant funding allocation: \$400.

New Zealand Certificate in Health and Wellbeing (Rehabilitation Support) Brain Injury - Level 4

120 credits, apprenticeship

The purpose of the qualification is to provide organisations within the health and wellbeing sectors with graduates who have the skills and knowledge to provide rehabilitation support as well as personal and/or peer leadership, under the direction and delegation of a health professional. This programme leads to the qualification of New Zealand Apprenticeship in Brain Injury Rehabilitation Support.

Training grant funding allocation: \$2,000.

National Certificate in Adult Literacy and Numeracy Education (Vocational Workplace) - Level 5

40 credits, average duration variable

This qualification recognises expertise in adult education and training, and thereby contributes to the improvement of the foundation skills (literacy and numeracy) of adult learners in New Zealand.

Training grant funding allocation: \$800.

Diploma in Rehabilitation Studies - Level 5

120 credits

This is a Massey University qualification. People will acquire general knowledge and skills at an introductory level in rehabilitation. They will have a working understanding of the impact of disability on the lives of those affected and the processes and interventions used to remediate the impacts, as well as the issues affecting rehabilitation and the means to measure outcomes.

Training grant funding allocation: \$2,000.

New Zealand Diploma in Health and Wellbeing (Applied Practice) - Level 5

120 credits

This qualification is designed for experienced people working in the Health and Wellbeing sector; people wanting to enter the sector; and professionals seeking development opportunities within a health and wellbeing setting.

Training grant funding allocation: \$2,000.

New Zealand Diploma in Hearing Therapy - Level 6

120 credits

The purpose of this qualification is to provide the hearing sector with a specialised hearing therapy workforce focussed on the application of aural rehabilitation practice, including technical knowledge and skills, in clinical and community settings. This qualification is targeted at people seeking to further develop their knowledge, skills and abilities in the field of Hearing Therapy.

Training grant funding allocation: \$2,000.

Diploma in Vision Habilitation/Rehabilitation with strands in Daily Living, Low Vision Therapy, Orientation and Mobility, and Technology and Communication - Level 7

157 credits

The purpose of this qualification is to provide the vision habilitation/rehabilitation sector with a specialised workforce focussed on the application of technical knowledge and skills in clinical and community settings. This qualification is targeted at people seeking to further develop their knowledge, skills and abilities in one or more of the vision habilitation/rehabilitation fields.

Training grant funding allocation: \$2,000.
