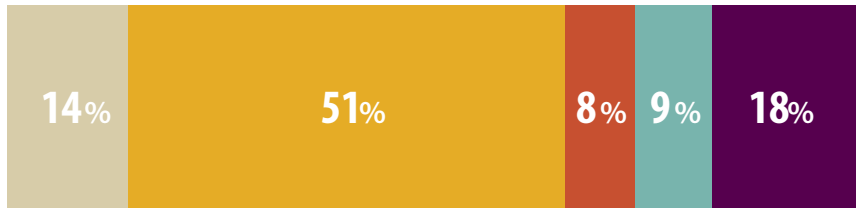

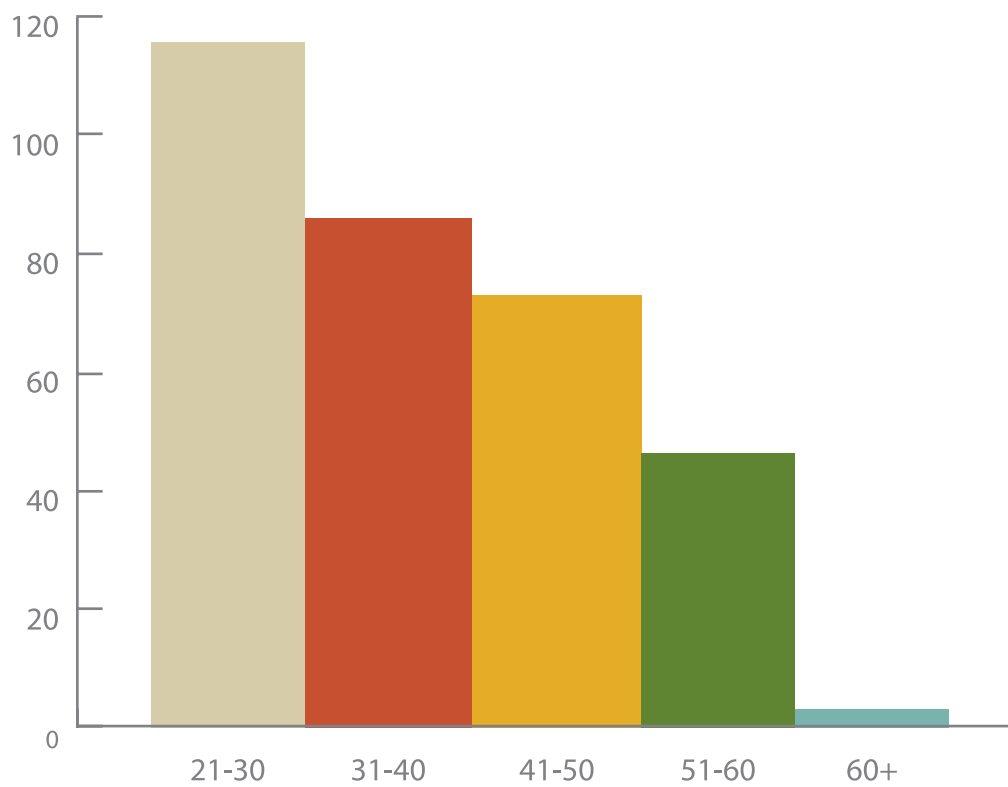

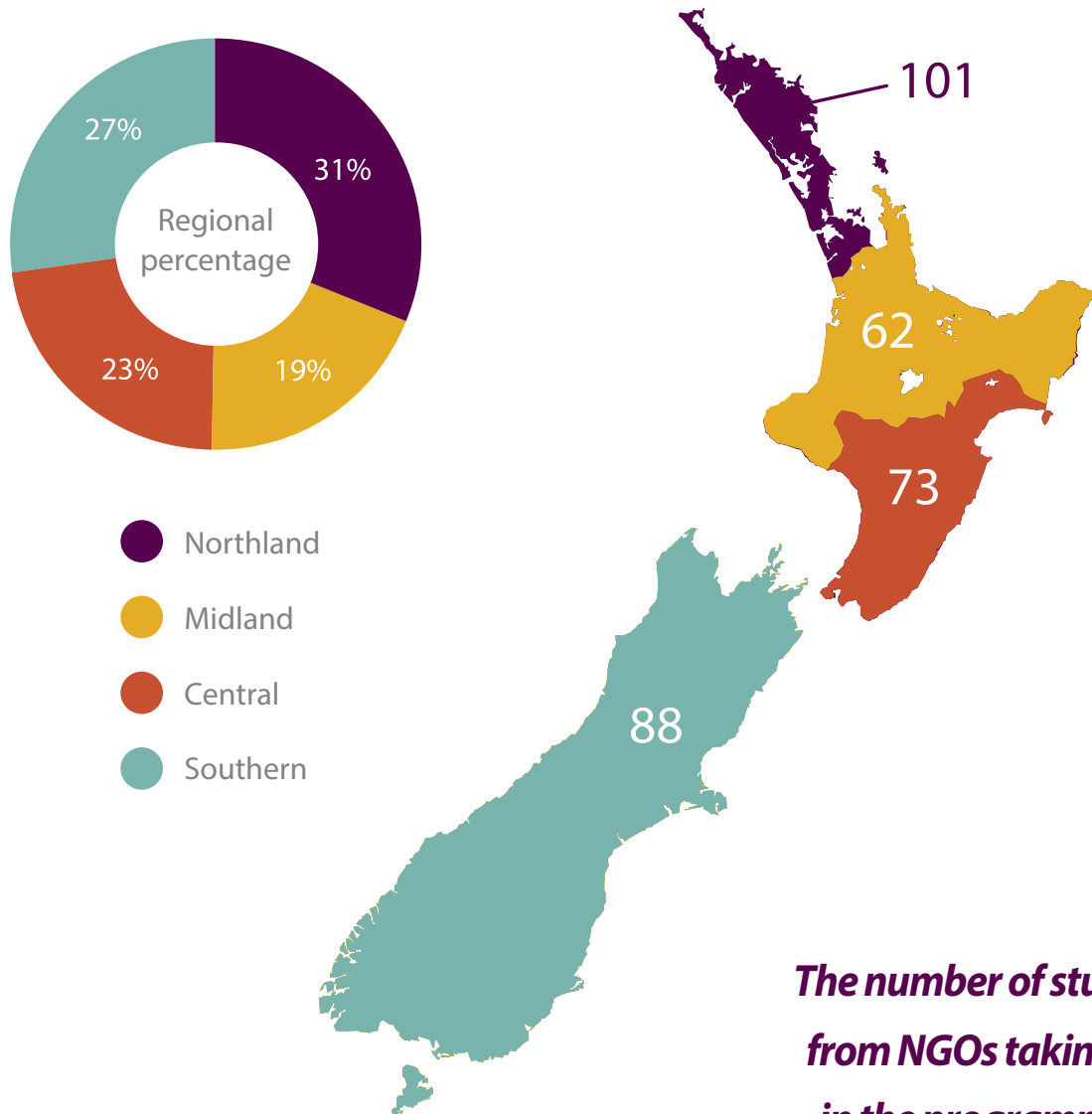

Age range



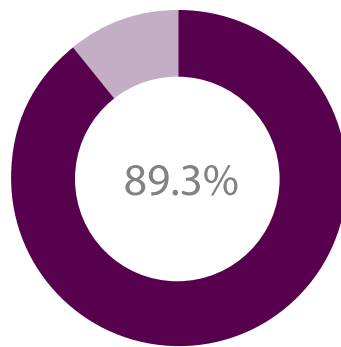
Number of students per region
