

What is important at Admission?



This infographic uses HoNOS data from adult mental health services from October 2019 to September 2020. For more information see the [full report](#) and refer to the accompanying [user guide](#).

This report uses HoNOS (Health of the Nation Outcome Scales) data. HoNOS is a simple measure used in adult services. It has 12 items scored from 0 to 4 where 0 is no problem and 4 is a serious problem.

Average number of items which are clinically significant on admission

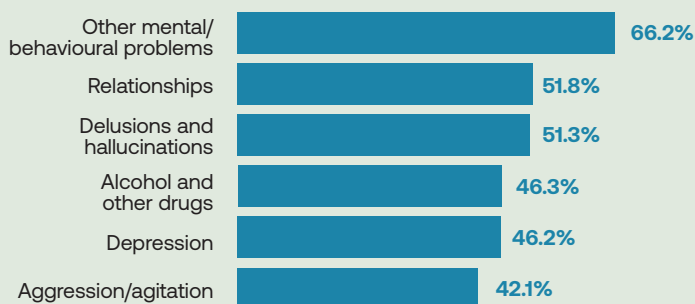
Clinically significant is when the item has a score of 2 to 4 for HoNOS. (moderate to severe problems).



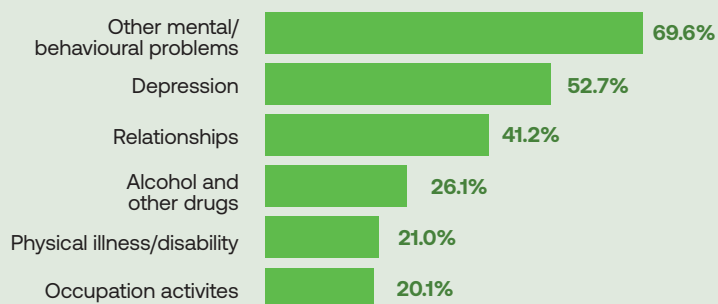
Top 6 items with highest percentage which are clinically significant on admission

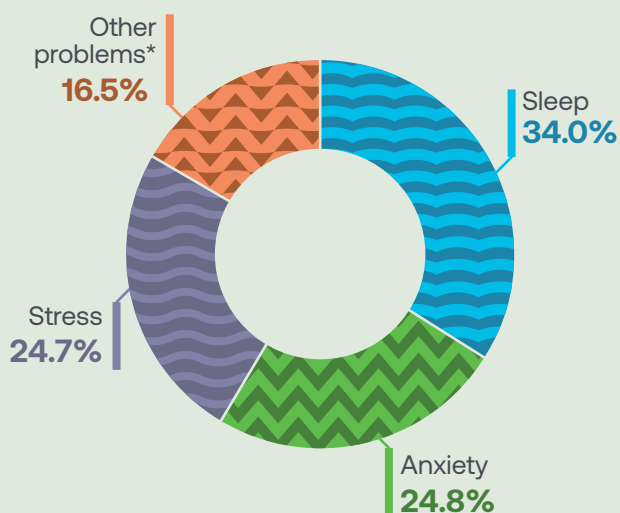

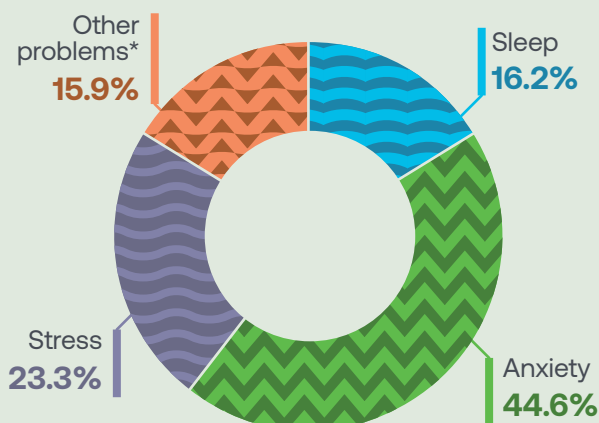
Other mental/behavioural problems on admission
