PRIMHD online

ADOM is up and running on PRIMHD Online.

To access ADOM outcomes collections, login to your system as usual. When inputting data you will find the Collection Occasion Module sitting beside the Activity Module. Enter a service user activity, then click on the Collection Occasion button. The ADOM reporting requirements will pop up - there are drop down boxes with the necessary answers for you to select.

PRIMHD standards

The data process standard, data set and code set documents have been updated following the PRIMHD HISO review. The documents and details of the review can be found on the IT Health Board website.

The PRIMHD data process standard describes the workflow and processes for PRIMHD data gathered during the care of the consumer (from referral and admission through to discharge), and how the PRIMHD data set and code set relates to the different record types during these processes.

PRIMHD data set

Represents the entire set of data elements that will be collected and stored within the PRIMHD records, including specific data elements for ADOM collection and reporting.

PRIMHD code set

A collection of common codes that are required by specific data elements within the data set, including those specifically for use by AOD services reporting ADOM. <http://www.health.govt.nz/nz-health-statistics/national-collections-and-surveys/collections/primhd-mental-health-data/primhd-standards>

PRIMHD code set additional information for ADOM

In addition to the referral and activity information currently submitted to PRIMHD, alcohol and other drug addiction providers eligible to collect and report ADOM will also now send the following data.

The PRIMHD code set document includes all the required values for ADOM. It should be read in conjunction with the PRIMHD business process document and the data set. A marked up code set is available by contacting Alison.Bower@tepou.co.nz. This identifies those sections relating to ADOM or valid values for ADOM which relate to the ADOM form and valid values that your system currently collects. Much like activity, ADOM collections must be linked to a referral.

The two ADOM elements **mode of administration** and **collection status** form part of the outcome tool table. These can be defaulted for each ADOM collection to codes MA03 or MA04 depending on how the information is collected locally. For collection status default CS01 or CS08.

Note that the code set document does not include valid values for three ADOM data elements that can be found in the *Te Pou Systems Information Document* and *ADOM form*. These are:

- **number of days covered 2.7.1.4**
- **mandated/voluntary indicator 2.7.1.5**
- **CEP status 2.7.1.6.**

These three data elements have not yet been added to PRIMHD and cannot yet be submitted via extract. They must be collected for local use until they are added to PRIMHD in the 2016 NCAMP update.

Please note that Q7 Other Drugs a, b and c are the **drug name** and Q7 d, e, f are the **number of days** used. They both appear in the Code Set document as 7 a, b and c.
