

What is important at clinical review?



This infographic uses HoNOS (Health of the Nation Outcome Scales) data from adult mental health services from April 2020 to March 2021, focusing on HoNOS review collections. Review collections are completed every three months and review - other collections can be collected at any time. Both collections are included in this infographic. For more information see the **full report** and refer to the accompanying **user guide**.

HoNOS is a simple measure used in adult services. It has 12 items scored from 0 to 4 where 0 is no problem and 4 is a serious problem.

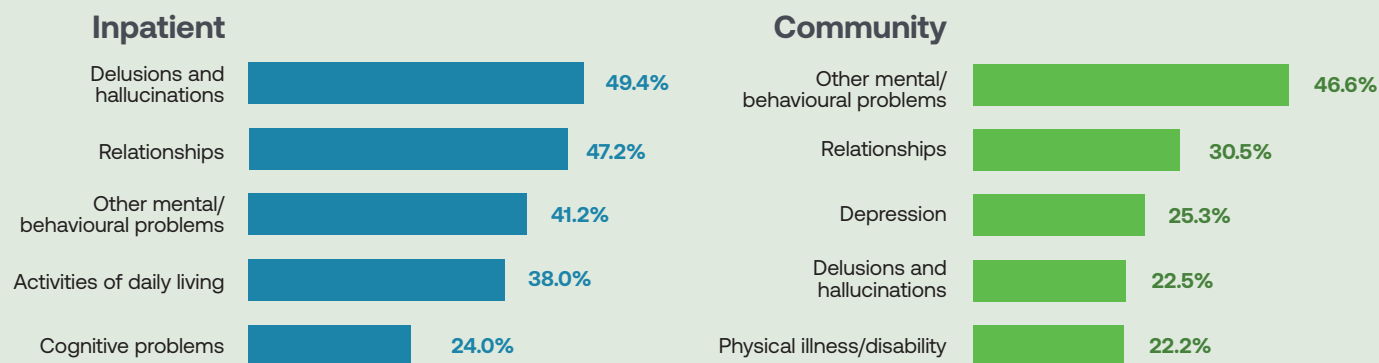
Average number of items which are clinically significant

Clinically significant is when an item has a score of 2 to 4 (*moderate to severe problems*) on HoNOS.



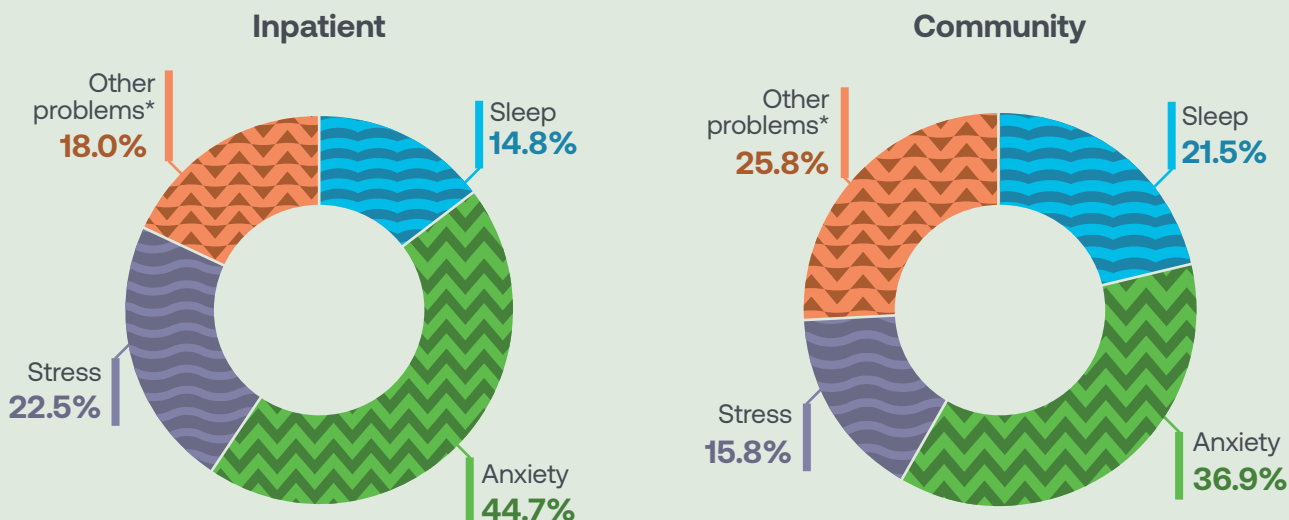
Top 5 items with highest percentage which are clinically significant

* Other problems include categories where numbers are small: Phobic, Obsessive-compulsive, Dissoriative, Somatoform, Eating, Sexual and Other.
